## The Apostle Paul, Servant of Christ

Who was Paul of Tarsus? A Jewish Pharisee converted to Christ, who became the greatest Christian to ever serve Christ. His courageous ministry brought non-Jews in Christianity and changed it forever. He is the most prolific writer in the New Testament with almost half the 27 documents attributed to him. His religious thought became the foundation for the Protestant Reformation.

He was a controversial figure in early Christianity, and remains so even today. His words continue to challenge and provoke Christians to both think and reflect.

**W**ords from him in his letters still fascinate the brightest minds of our day with both their simplicity and profundity at the same time. Literally thousands of books have been written about him in an ongoing effort to grasp his thought.

Our study will seek to touch on the various aspects of his contribution to Christianity by looking at him as a person, a missionary, and a writer.

**C**ome to the study and learn how this great man was used by God to shape the Christian faith for all time.

- The objective of the study is to create a greater awareness of the contribution of this apostle to our Christian faith. A survey of his letters and relevant parts of the Acts of the Apostles will be covered. A brief exposure to the Church Fathers and their perspectives on Paul will be included.
