First Peter is a neglected treasure of spiritual insight. Only in recent times have Bible students begun to value the vast amount of wisdom contained in this small letter. When you click on the Bible Study Series, you will notice the column containing the studies on First Peter. Two sets of studies are being created in this study.

First, the hyperlink embedded in the study number, e.g., 01, 02 etc., will contain the Costa Rican studies. These use a Spanish translation along with the Greek and two English language translations as the basis for the study.

Second, the hyperlink embedded in the scripture text listing, e.g., 1 Pet. 1:1-2 etc., will contain the German studies. Instead of a Spanish translation, a German translation is used along with the three other texts.

The work is in progress with 14 of the German studies complete, and 5 of the Costa Rica studies completed. These two sets of studies are being produced for two separate Bible study groups, one at the IBC church in San José, Costa Rica, and the other for the Friday evening Bible study group at the Baptisten Gemeinde in Bonn, Germany. The contents of both studies are essentially the same, just the shift in the one non-English translation used.

Of course, any of the materials at cranfordville.com are available for viewing and most of the documents can be downloaded and printed out. The vast majority of the documents are in the Adobe pdf file format, and thus require the free Acrobat Reader for viewing and printing. This reader can be secured free at Adobe.com from the internet.

Cranfordville is a ministry of C&L Designs and reflects my almost forty years of study, preaching, and teaching the Bible in churches around the world and in two institutions of higher education: Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (Ft. Worth, Texas) and Gardner-Webb University (Boiling Springs, North Carolina).
