

- 2.1.1.3 Paul's Second Recollection, Acts 26:1-20
  - Narrative Introduction, 25:23-26:1
  - The Defense Speech, 26:2-24
    - Introduction, vv. 2-11 (26:4-11 // 22:3-5 // 9:1-2)
    - Conversion, vv. 12-18 (26:12-18 // 22:6-11 // 9:3-8)
    - Subsequent Ministry, vv. 19-23
  - Narrative Conclusion, 26:24-32





- General Observations about the three narratives in Acts:
  - 1. Luke builds case for Paul's innocency
  - 2. Only in third narrative does Paul's promised suffering become clear
  - 3. Modern skepticism fails to grasp Luke' methodology
  - 4. Narratives build to third climatic depiction in chap.
     26 with greatest amount of historical & theological detail.
  - 5. Luke displays his exceptional skills as history writer
