




8.1.1.2 Arrest in the temple, Acts 21:27-36 pt. 1, vv. 27-28

27 Ώς δὲ ἔμελλον αἱ ἐπτὰ ἡμέραι συντελεῖσθαι, οἱ ἀπὸ τῆς Ἁσίας Ἰουδαῖοι θεασάμενοι αὐτὸν ἐν τῷ ἱερῷ συνέχεον πάντα τὸν ὅχλον καὶ ἐπέβαλον ἐπ' αὐτὸν τὰς χεῖρας 28 κράζοντες· ἄνδρες Ἰσραηλῖται, βοηθεῖτε· οὖτός ἐστιν ὁ ἄνθρωπος ὁ κατὰ τοῦ λαοῦ καὶ τοῦ νόμου καὶ τοῦ τόπου τούτου πάντας πανταχῇ διδάσκων, ἔτι τε καὶ Ἑλληνας εἰσήγαγεν εἰς τὸ ἰερὸν καὶ κεκοίνωκεν τὸν ἄγιον τόπον τοῦτον.

27 When the seven days were almost completed, the Jews from Asia, who had seen him in the temple, stirred up the whole crowd. They seized him, 28 shouting, "Fellow Israelites, help! This is the man who is teaching everyone everywhere against our people, our law, and this place; more than that, he has actually brought Greeks into the temple and has defiled this holy place."



8.1.1.2 Arrest in the temple, Acts 21:27-36 pt. 2, vv. 29-30

29 ἦσαν γὰρ προεωρακότες Τρόφιμον τὸν Ἐφέσιον ἐν τῇ πόλει σὺν αὐτῷ, ὃν ἐνόμιζον ὅτι εἰς τὸ ἰερὸν εἰσήγαγεν ὁ Παῦλος. 30 ἐκινήθη τε ἡ πόλις ὅλη καὶ ἐγένετο συνδρομὴ τοῦ λαοῦ, καὶ ἐπιλαβόμενοι τοῦ Παύλου εἶλκον αὐτὸν ἔξω τοῦ ἰεροῦ καὶ εὐθέως ἐκλείσθησαν αἰ θύραι.

29 For they had previously seen Trophimus the Ephesian with him in the city, and they supposed that Paul had brought him into the temple. 30 Then all the city was aroused, and the people rushed together. seized Paul and They dragged him out of the temple, and immediately the doors were shut.






8.1.1.2 Arrest in the temple, Acts 21:27-36 pt. 3, vv. 31-32

31 Ζητούντων τε αὐτὸν ἀποκτεῖναι ἀνέβη φάσις τῷ χιλιάρχῳ τῆς σπείρης ὅτι ὅλη συγχύννεται Ἱερουσαλήμ. 32 ος ἐξαυτῆς παραλαβὼν στρατιώτας καὶ ἐκατοντάρχας κατέδραμεν ἐπ' αὐτούς, οἱ δὲ ἰδόντες τὸν χιλίαρχον καὶ τοὺς στρατιώτας ἐπαύσαντο τύπτοντες τὸν Παῦλον.

31 While they were trying to kill him, word came to the tribune of the cohort that all Jerusalem was in uproar. 32 Immediately he took soldiers and centurions and ran down to them. When they saw the tribune and the soldiers. they stopped beating Paul.

8.1.1.2 Arrest in the temple, Acts 21:27-36 pt. 4, vv. 33-34

33 τότε ἐγγίσας ὁ χιλίαρχος ἐπελάβετο αὐτοῦ καὶ ἐκέλευσεν δεθῆναι ἀλύσεσιν δυσίν, καὶ ἐπυνθάνετο τίς εἵη καὶ τί ἐστιν πεποιηκώς. 34 ἄλλοι

δὲ ἄλλο τι έπεφώνουν έν τῷ ὅχλῳ. μή ὅυναμένου ὅἐ αὐτοῦ γνῶναι τὸ ἀσφαλες διὰ τὸν θόρυβον ἐκέλευσεν ἄιγεσθαι αὐτὸν εἰς-τὴν παρεμβολήν.

33 Then the tribune came, arrested him, and ordered him, and ordered him to be bound with two chains; he inquired who he was and what he had done 34. Some in the crowd shouted one thing, some another; and as he could not learn the facts because of the uproar, he ordered him to be brought into the barracks.





8.1.1.2 Arrest in the temple, Acts 21:27-36 pt. 5, vv. 35-36

35 ὅτε δὲ ἐγένετο ἐπὶ τοὺς ἀναβαθμούς, συνέβη βαστάζεσθαι αὐτὸν ὑπὸ τῶν στρατιωτῶν διὰ τὴν βίαν τοῦ ὅχλου, 36 ἡκολούθει γὰρ τὸ πλῆθος τοῦ λαοῦ κράζοντες· αἶρε αὐτόν.

35 When Paul came to the steps, the violence of the mob was so great that he had to be carried by the soldiers. 36 The crowd that

followed kept shouting, "Away with him!"

8.1.1.3.1 Narrative Introduction, Acts 21:37-40

37 Μέλλων τε εἰσάγεσθαι εἰς τὴν παρεμβολὴν ὁ Παϋλος λέγει τῷ χιλιάρχῳ· εἰ ἔξεστίν μοι εἰπεϊν τι πρὸς σέ; ὁ δὲ ἔφη· Ἑλληνιατὶ γινώσκεις; 38 οὐκ ἄρα σὐ εἰ ὁ Αἰγύπτιος ὁ πρὸ τούτων τῶν ἡμερῶν ἀναστατῶρας καὶ ἐξαγαγὼν εἰς τὴν ἔρημον τοὺς τετρακισχιλίους ἄνδρας τῶν σικαρίων; 39 εἶπεν δὲ ὁ Παϋλος· ἐγὼ ἄνθρωπος μέν εἰμι Ἰουδαϊος, Ταρσεὺς τῆς Κιλικίας, οὐκ ἀσήμου πόλεως πολίτης· δέομαι δέ σου, ἐπίτρεψόν μοι λακήσὰι πρὸς τὸν λαόν; θῦ ἐπιτρέψαντος δὲ αὐτοῦ ὁ Ἡτῶλος ἐστὸς ἐπὶ τῶν ἀναβαθμῶν κατέσεισεν τῆ χειρί τῶ λαῷ. πολλῆς δὲ σιγῆς γενομένης προσεφώνησεν τῆ Ἑβραίδιιδιαλέκτω λέγων·

37 Just as Paul was about to be brought into the barracks, he said to the tribune, "May I say something to you?" The tribune replied, "Da you know Greek? 32 Then you are not the Egyptian who recently stilled up a revolt and led the four thousand assassins out into the wilderness?" 39 Paul replied, "I am a Jew, from Tarsus in Cilicia, a citizen of an important city. I beg you, let me speak to the people." 40 When he had given him permission, Paul stood on the steps and motioned to the people for silence; and when there was a great hush, he addressed them in the Hebrew language/saying:

- 1. Religious hostility looks for an excuse to cause trouble, vv. 27-29
- 2. A mob mentality will do things individuals might not, vv. 30-31
- 3. Religious persecution produces unexpected friends, vv.
   32-36
- 4. Always get accurate information 'on the table,' vv. 37-39
- 5. When possible be prepared to defend your faith, v. 40
