8.1.3.3.1 Trouble at Sea, Acts 27:13-20, pt. 1, vv. 13-14

13 Ὑποπνεύσαντος δὲ νότου
δόξαντες τῆς προθέσεως
κεκρατηκέναι, ἄραντες ἄσπον
παρελέγοντο τὴν Κρήτην. 14 μετ' οὐ
πολὺ δὲ ἔβαλεν κατ' αὐτῆς ἄνεμος
τυφωνικός ὁ καλούμενος εὐρακύλων·

13 When a moderate south wind began to blow, they thought they could achieve their purpose; so they weighed anchor and began to sail past Crete, close to the shore. 14 But soon a violent wind, called the northeaster, rushed down from Crete.

8.1.3.3.1 Trouble at Sea, Acts 27:13-20, pt. 2, v. 15

15 συναρπασθέντος δὲ τοῦ πλοίου καὶ μὴ δυναμένου ἀντοφθαλμεῖν τῷ ἀνέμῳ ἐπιδόντες ἐφερόμεθα.

15 Since the ship was caught and could not be turned head-on into the wind, we gave way to it and were driven.

8.1.3.3.1 Trouble at Sea, Acts 27:13-20, pt. 3, vs. 16-17

16 νησίον δέ τι ὑποδραμόντες καλούμενον Καῦδα ἰσχύσαμεν μόλις περικρατεῖς γενέσθαι τῆς σκάφης, 17 ἦν ἄραντες βοηθείαις ἐχρῶντο ὑποζωννύντες τὸ πλοῖον, φοβούμενοί τε μὴ εἰς τὴν Σύρτιν ἐκπέσωσιν, χαλάσαντες τὸ σκεῦος, οὕτως ἐφέροντο.

16 *By running under the lee of a small island called Cauda we were scarcely able to get the ship's boat under control. 17 After hoisting it up they took measures to undergird the ship; then, fearing that they would run on the Syrtis, they lowered the sea anchor and so were driven.*

8.1.3.3.1 Trouble at Sea, Acts 27:13-20, pt. 4, vs. 18-19

18 σφοδρῶς δὲ χειμαζομένων ἡμῶν τῇ ἐξῆς ἐκβολὴν ἐποιοῦντο 19 καὶ τῇ τρίτῃ αὐτόχειρες τὴν σκευὴν τοῦ πλοίου ἔρριψαν.



18 We were being pounded by the storm so violently that on the next day they began to throw the cargo overboard, 19 and on the third day with their own hands they threw the ship's tackle overboard.

8.1.3.3.1 Trouble at Sea, Acts 27:13-20, pt. 5, v. 20

20 μήτε δὲ ἡλίου μήτε ἄστρων ἐπιφαινόντων ἐπὶ πλείονας ἡμέρας, χειμῶνός τε οὐκ ὀλίγου ἐπικειμένου, λοιπὸν περιηρεῖτο ἐλπίς πᾶσα τοῦ σώζεσθαι ἡμᾶς.

20 When neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no small tempest raged, all hope of our being saved was at last abandoned.

8.1.3.3.2 Adrift at Sea, Acts 27:21-26, pt. 1, vv. 21-22

21 Πολλῆς τε ἀσιτίας ὑπαρχούσης τότε σταθεῖς ὁ Παῦλος ἐν μέσῳ αὐτῶν εἶπεν· ἔδει μὲν, ὦ ἄνδρες, πειθαρχήσαντάς μοι μὴ ἀνάγεσθαι ἀπὸ τῆς Κρήτης κερδήσαι τε τὴν ὕβριν ταύτην καὶ τὴν ζημίαν. 22 καὶ τὰ νῦν παραινῶ ὑμᾶς εὐθυμεῖν· ἀποβολὴ γὰρ ψυχῆς οὐδεμία ἔσται ἐξ ὑμῶν πλὴν τοῦ πλοίου.

21 Since they had been without food for a long time, Paul then stood up among them and said, "Men, you should have listened to me and not have set sail from Crete and thereby avoided this damage and loss. 22 I urge you now to keep up your courage, for there will be no loss of life among you, but only of the ship.

8.1.3.3.2 Adrift at Sea, Acts 27:21-26, pt. 2, vv. 23-24

23 παρέστη γάρ μοι ταύτη τῇ νυκτὶ τοῦ θεοῦ, οὗ εἰμι [ἐγὼ] ὧ καὶ λατρεύω, ἄγγελος 24 λέγων· μὴ φοβοῦ, Παῦλε, Καίσαρι σε δεῖ παραστήναι, καὶ ἰδοὺ κεχάρισται σοι ὁ θεὸς πάντας τοὺς πλέοντας μετὰ σοῦ.

23 For last night there stood by me an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I worship, 24 and he said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul; you must stand before the emperor; and indeed, God has granted safety to all those who are sailing with you.'

8.1.3.3.2 Adrift at Sea, Acts 27:21-26, pt. 3, vv. 25-26

25 διὸ εὐθυμεῖτε, ἄνδρες· πιστεύω γὰρ τῷ θεῷ ὅτι οὕτως ἔσται καθ' ὃν τρόπον λελάληταί μοι. 26 εἰς νῆσον δέ τινα δεῖ ἡμᾶς ἐκπεσεῖν.

25 So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will be exactly as I have been told. 26 But we will have to run aground on some island."

 - ✓ 1. Paul and his traveling companions had to trust God to take care of them.
 - ✓ 2. Paul sought to encourage everyone on board the ship.
 - ✓ 3. God reassured Paul of survival through a vision dream.
 - ✓ 4. God revealed His concern even for pagans and not just for His people on the ship.
