8.1.3.3.3 Despair at Sea, Acts 27:27-32, pt. 1, vv. 27-28

27 Ὡς δὲ τεσσαρεσκαίδεκάτῃ νύξ ἐγένετο διαφερομένων ἡμῶν ἐν τῷ Ἀδρία, κατὰ μέσον τῆς νυκτὸς ὑπενόουν οἱ ναῦται προσάγειν πινὰ αὐτοῖς χώραν. 28 καὶ βολίσαντες εὗρον ὀργυιᾶς εἴκοσι, βραχὺ δὲ διαστήσαντες καὶ πάλιν βολίσαντες εὗρον ὀργυιᾶς δεκαπέντε·

27 When the fourteenth night had come, as we were drifting across the sea of Adria, about midnight the sailors suspected that they were nearing land. 28 So they took soundings and found twenty fathoms; a little farther on they took soundings again and found fifteen fathoms.

8.1.3.3.3 Despair at Sea, Acts 27:27-32, pt. 3, vv. 30-31

30 Τῶν δὲ ναυτῶν ζητούντων φυγεῖν ἐκ τοῦ πλοίου καὶ χαλασάντων τὴν σκάφην εἰς τὴν θάλασσαν προφάσει ὡς ἐκ πῶρης ἀγκύρας μελλόντων ἐκτείνειν, 31 εἶπεν ὁ Παῦλος τῷ ἑκατοντάρχη καὶ τοῖς στρατιώταις· ἐὰν μὴ οὗτοι μείνωσιν ἐν τῷ πλοίῳ, ὑμεῖς σωθῆναι οὐ δύνασθε.

30 But when the sailors tried to escape from the ship and had lowered the boat into the sea, on the pretext of putting out anchors from the bow, 31 Paul said to the centurion and the soldiers, "Unless these men stay in the ship, you cannot be saved."

32 τότε ἀπέκοψαν οἱ στρατιῶται τὰ σχοινία τῆς σκάφης καὶ εἶσαν αὐτὴν ἔκπεσεῖν.



32 Then the soldiers cut away the ropes of the boat and set it adrift.

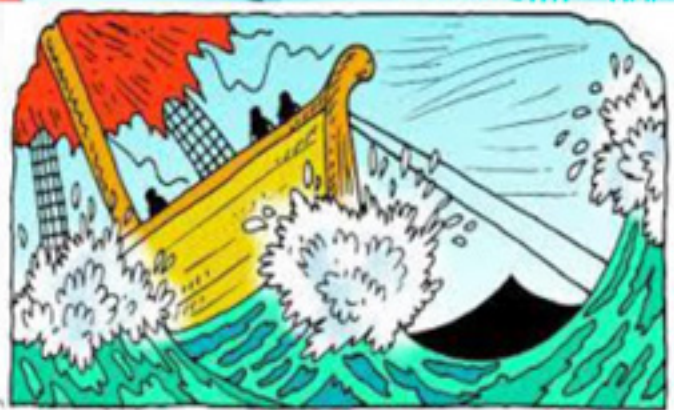

8.1.3.3.4 Paul encourages everyone, Acts 27:33-38, pt. 1, vv. 33-34

33 Ἄχρι δὲ οὗ ἡμέρα ἤμελλον γίνεσθαι, παρεκάλει ὁ Παῦλος ἅπαντας μεταλαβεῖν τροφῆς λέγων· τεσσαρεσκαίδεκάτην σήμερον ἡμέραν προσδοκῶντες ἄσιτοι διατελεῖτε μὴθὲν προσλαβόμενοι. 34 διὸ παρακαλῶ ὑμᾶς μεταλαβεῖν τροφῆς· τοῦτο γὰρ πρὸς τῆς ὑμετέρας σωτηρίας ὑπάρχει, οὐδενὸς γὰρ ὑμῶν θριξὶ ἀπὸ τῆς κεφαλῆς ἀπολεῖται.

33 Just before daybreak, Paul urged all of them to take some food, saying, "Today is the fourteenth day that you have been in suspense and remaining without food, having eaten nothing. 34 Therefore I urge you to take some food, for it will help you survive; for none of you will lose a hair from your heads."

35 εἶπας δὲ ταῦτα καὶ λαβὼν ἄρτον
εὐχαρίστησεν τῷ θεῷ ἐνώπιον πάντων
καὶ κλάσας ἤρξατο ἐσθίειν.



35 After he had said this, he took bread; and giving thanks to God in the presence of all, he broke it and began to eat.

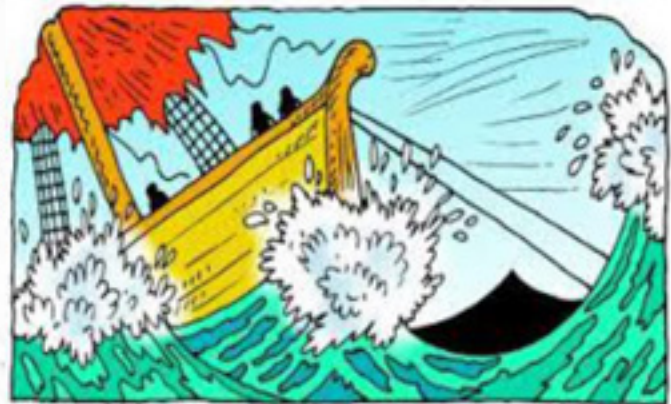

8.1.3.3.4 Paul encourages everyone, Acts 27:33-38, pt. 3, vv. 36-37

36 εὐθυμοὶ δὲ γενόμενοι πάντες καὶ αὐτοὶ προσελάβοντο τροφῆς. 37 ἡμεθεὶ δὲ αἱ πᾶσαι ψυχαὶ ἐν τῷ πλοίῳ διακόσμαι ἐβδομήκοντα ἕξ.



36 Then all of them were encouraged and took food for themselves. 37 (We were in all two hundred seventy-six persons in the ship.)

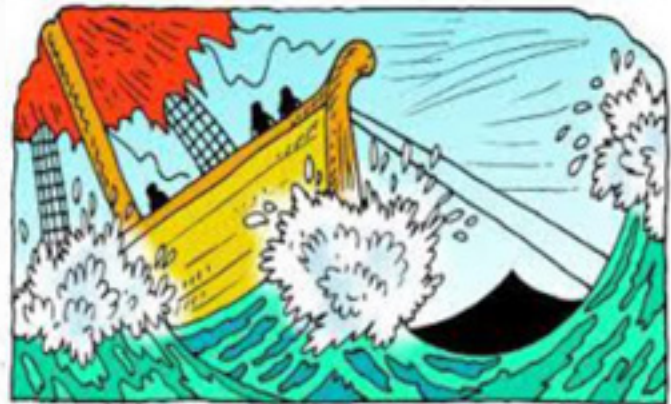

8.1.3.3.4 Paul encourages everyone, Acts 27:33-38, pt. 4, v. 38

38 κορεσθέντες δὲ τροφῆς ἐκούφιζον τὸ πλοῖον ἐκβαλλόμενοι τὸν σῖτον εἰς τὴν θάλασσαν.



38 After they had satisfied their hunger, they lightened the ship by throwing the wheat into the sea.

- **What can we learn from the third leg of the voyage to Rome?**
 - ✓ 1. Using navigational skills was good common sense
 - ✓ 2. Paul spoke bravely in his warning about some abandoning ship
 - ✓ 3. The Roman soldiers did not think ahead in cutting loose the small boat
 - ✓ 4. Paul made some bold promises about the safety of everyone on the ship.
 - ✓ 5. Paul's example in eating became a good example to the others
