8.1.3.4.1 Shipwreck at Malta, Acts 27:39-44, pt. 1, v. 39

39 Ὅτε δὲ ἡμέρα ἐγένετο, τὴν γῆν οὐκ ἐπεγίνωσκον, κόλπον δὲ τινα κατενόουν ἔχοντα αἰγιαλὸν εἰς ὃν ἐβουλεύοντο εἰ δύναιντο ἐξῶσαι τὸ πλοῖον.

39 In the morning they did not recognize the land, but they noticed a bay with a beach, on which they planned to run the ship ashore, if they could.

8.1.3.4.1 Shipwreck at Malta, Acts 27:39-44, pt. 2, v. 40

40 καὶ τὰς ἀγκύρας περιελόντες εἶων εἰς τὴν θάλασσαν, ἅμα ἀνέντες τὰς ζευκτηρίας τῶν πηδαλίων καὶ ἐπάραντες τὸν ἀρτέμωνα τῇ πνεύσῃ κατεῖχον εἰς τὸν αἰγιαλόν.

40 So they cast off the anchors and left them in the sea. At the same time they loosened the ropes that tied the steering-oars; then hoisting the foresail to the wind, they made for the beach.

1 περιπεσόντες δὲ εἰς τόπον
διθάλασσον ἐπέκειλαν τὴν ναῦν καὶ
ἡ μὲν πρῶρα ἐρείσασα ἔμεινεν
ἀσάλευτος, ἡ δὲ πρύμνα ἐλύετο ὑπὸ
τῆς βίας [τῶν κυμάτων].

41 *But striking a reef, they ran the ship aground; the bow stuck and remained immovable, but the stern was being broken up by the force of the waves.*

42 Τῶν δὲ στρατιωτῶν βουλή
ἐγένετο ἵνα τοὺς δεσμώτας
ἀποκτείνωσιν, μή τις ἐκκολυμβήσας
διαφύγῃ.

42 The soldiers' plan was to kill
the prisoners, so that none
might swim away and escape;

8.1.3.4.1 Shipwreck at Malta, Acts 27:39-44, pt. 5, vv. 43-44a

43 ὁ δὲ ἑκατοντάρχης βουλόμενος διασῶσαι τὸν Παῦλον ἐκώλυσεν αὐτοὺς τοῦ βουλήματος, ἐκέλευσέν τε τοὺς δυναμένους κολυμβᾶν ἀπορίψαντας πρώτους ἐπὶ τὴν γῆν ἐξιέναι 44 καὶ τοὺς λοιποὺς οὓς μὲν ἐπὶ σανίσιν, οὓς δὲ ἐπὶ πινῶν τῶν ἀπὸ τοῦ πλοίου.

43 but the centurion, wishing to save Paul, kept them from carrying out their plan. He ordered those who could swim to jump overboard first and make for the land, 44 and the rest to follow, some on planks and others on pieces of the ship.



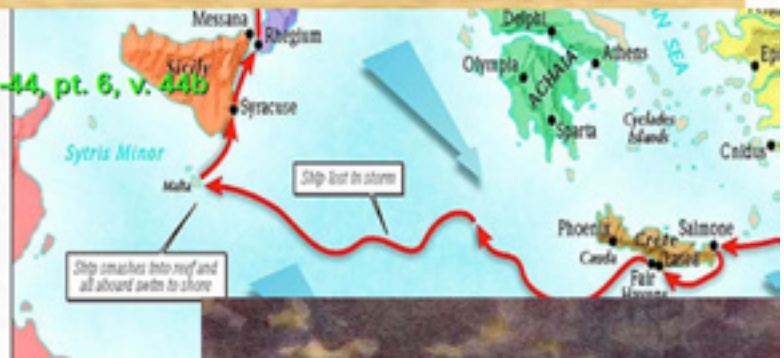

καὶ οὕτως ἐγένετο πάντα
διασωθῆναι ἐπὶ τὴν γῆν.



*And so it was that all were brought
safely to land.*

- **What can we learn from the third leg of the voyage to Rome?**
 - ✓ 1. The sailors followed standard procedure to beach the ship.
 - ✓ 2. The hidden barrier out in the bay changed everything.
 - ✓ 3. The Roman soldiers prepared to follow standard procedure with the prisoners.
 - ✓ 4. The generosity of Julius, the Roman centurion, changed everything.
 - ✓ 5. God protected Paul through all of this ordeal.
