8.1.5.3 Reconstruction of Ministry n 1) Data confirms that Paul was released from fi 2) Problems with constructing a picture of ministry activity 3) The big uncertainty is whether Paul traveled to Spain or not 4) Some of the church fathers assert such a trip but others do not. 5) Primary source for information comes from NT apocrypha sources 6) The Actus Vercellenes section in the Acts of Peter is the main source 7) Spanish traditions of Paul being in Spain are very limited Otto F.A. Meinardus, "Paul's Missionary Journey to Spain," The Biblical Archaeologist (41, no. 2, June 1978), pp. 61-63 8) My conclusion from assessing the data is that most likely Paul did STEDITERRANEA? not go to Spain. -Galilee **JERUSALEM** ludea

8.1.6 Subsequent arrest and execution AN EMPIRE

- · Length of ministry difficult to determine
- Possible ranges from 63 AD to ??
- The terminus depends on when Nero executed Paul.
- This in turn depends upon whether Paul's death was linked to the fire in Rome at 64 AD
- If it was linked, then an execution date of 64-65
- If it was not linked, then an execution date of 66-67
