To the members and friends of the IBC Church Cologne:

Claire and I want to share with you the opening doors of ministry that God is providing us in another part of His world.

Since last fall we have sensed God's leadership moving us to an end of our time in Europe. In the beginning, we had no idea how that leading of God was going to direct our paths. Not until less than a month ago was the path clear for us. All we could sense was that our time in working with the IBC church in Cologne was comprayer by both Claire and me. At nearly 69 ing to an end.

With surprising quickness and in a very unexpected direction, God opened the door for us to make another significant move in our lives both in ministry and in the location of ministry. On July 1-9, I made a trip to San Jose, Costa Rica to explore the possibility of ministry with the International Baptist Church of San Jose. The pastor and his wife, Paul and Dina Dreessen, graciously hosted me in Santa Ana, a suburb of San Jose on the far west side of the city. As we shared our concerns and discussed possible ministry with the church, the pastor enthusiastically encouraged me to consider helping him in developing new ministries and in lightening his heavy load of responsibilities. We will thus be stepping into a volunteer ministry helping the pastor. In less than twelve hours after arriving. I found an apartment that meets our needs wonderfully well, just two doors down from the pastor's apartment.

The IBC church San Jose is a strong congregation with two Sunday morning worship services averaging some 350 to 400 people in the two services. It is a strong discipling and ministering congregation with an excellent Sunday School program between the 8:30 and 11:00 am worship services, numerous home Bible study groups, a growing youth ministry, women's ministry, along with several other programs. They have beautiful facilities of their own, completely paid for, that is situated in the Septemmidst of the western part of the city (see the photo). Upwards of a 100,000 English speaking people live within a twenty minute drive of the church. The church has just San begun to tap into this enormous potential.

One of the first ministries that the pastor has asked Claire and ne to work on is the developing of a strong outreach to senior adults living in the area. The church already has a core group of 35 to 40 older adults. But ment in within the twenty minute drive of the church are some 13.000 retired citizens of the US alone who live there. This doesn't include an exploding number of European that God retirees. Occasional outreach efforts in the past have attracted large numbers of these folks, but until now no ongoing leadership of this effort was available.

The church, because of its size and location, is a major source of gospel influence in all of Costa Rica. The pastor envisions developing training programs for Costa Rican Baptist pastors who often have little formal training in leading their congregations. God seemingly wants to use my experience as a seminary and university professor to assist the pastor in this over the coming years.

This opportunity comes as an answer to years of age it is time for me to genuinely retire. But we have sought a way to continue in ministry on a part time basis without the huge stress and demands of being a senior pastor of a church. Beyond our dreams, God is answering this prayer by placing us in Costa Rica.

We will be living in Santa Ana, Costa Rica, on the far west side of San Jose. This is located in the Central Valley section of the country and is about 4.000 feet high elevation wise (appx. 1,200 meters). We are surrounded by mountains, some reaching as high as 13,500 feet (appx. 4,100 meters). Consequently the climate is very mild with a year around temperature that ranges from 65 to 80 degrees Fahrenheit (appx. 16 to 25 degrees Celsius). Year around snow skiing also possible nearby.

Our last Sunday at the church will be August 15. August 16-20 we will be cleaning out our apartment in preparation for a final inspection on Monday, August 23. Then on Thursday, August 26, we will fly to Charlotte, North Carolina, where we will spend a week visiting friends, especially in the First Baptist Church of

Shelby, NC. Then on ber 3 we will fly to Jose in order to set up house in the apart-Santa Ana.
