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DAY ONE: PAUL THE PERSON 1. **II. Paul's Family** A. Parents

Phil. 3:4b-6. If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: 5 circumcised on the eighth day, a member of III. Paul's Birth & Childhood the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; 6 as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

2 Cor. 11:22. Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they descendants of Abraham? So am I.

Acts 23:6. When Paul noticed that some were Sadducees and others were Pharisees, he called out in the council, "Brothers, I am a Pharisee, a son of Pharisees. I am on trial concerning the hope of the resurrection of the dead."

Jerome, De Viris Illustribus, 5. Paul, formerly called Saul, an apostle outside the number of the twelve apostles, was of the tribe of Benjamin and the town of Giscalis in Galilee. When this was taken by the Romans he removed with his parents to Tarsus in Cilicia.

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DAY ONE: PAUL THE PERSON I. II. Paul's Family **B. Siblings**

Acts 23:16. Now the son of Paul's sister heard about the ambush; so he went and gained entrance to the barracks and III. Paul's Birth & Childhood told Paul.

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Rom. 16:7. Greet Andronicus and Junia, my relatives who were in prison with me; they are prominent among the apostles, and III. Paul's Birth & Childhood they were in Christ before I was.

Rom. 16:11-12. 11 Greet my relative Herodion. Greet those in the Lord who belong to the family of Narcissus. 12 Greet those workers in the Lord, Tryphaena and Tryphosa. Greet the beloved Persis, who has worked hard in the Lord.

Rom. 16:21. Timothy, my co-worker, greets you; so do Lucius and Jason and Sosipater, my relatives.

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DAY ONE: PAUL THE PERSON 1 III. Paul's Birth - Childhood A. Tarsus B. Jerusalem

Acts 9:11. The Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul.

Acts 21:39. Paul replied, "I am a Jew, from Tarsus in Cilicia, a citizen of an important city; I beg you, let me speak to the people."

Acts 22:3. "I am a Jew, born in Tarsus in Cilicia, but brought up in this city at the feet of Gamaliel, educated strictly according to our ancestral law, being zealous for God, just as all of you are today.

Acts 26:4. "All the Jews know my way of life from my youth, a life spent from the beginning among my own people and in Jerusalem.

Gal 1:13-14. 13 You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. 14 I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors.
